

Franco Bruni

Professor of International Monetary Economics, Bocconi University, Milan.



Franco Bruni is full Professor of International Monetary Economics at Bocconi University, Milan. He holds a Degree in Economics from Università Bocconi and a Master of Science in Economics from MIT, Cambridge, United States.

Bruni is Member of the Department of Economics (Director from 1994 to 2000) and Member of the Board of Directors and of the Scientific Committee of the Centre for Monetary and Financial Economics "Paolo Baffi". He is Vice President and scientific director of ISPI, Milan's Institute for International Political Studies. Bruni is Member of the European Shadow Financial Regulatory Committee and of the Council of Management of the Société Universitaire Européenne de Recherches Financières (President from 1998 to 2000). He worked for parliamentary and governmental study groups on the Italian banking and financial system. He is Member of the editorial board (former Editor) of the *Giornale degli economisti e annali di economia*, of the advisory board of the *Journal of Financial Stability* and of the scientific committee of the *Rivista di Politica Economica*.

Bruni writes editorials for *La Stampa* and he is author of several articles and publications.

Bruni is a non-executive, independent Director of Pirelli SpA since 2005 and of Pioneer Global Asset Management SpA since 2000. He has been an independent Director of Saipem SpA from 1998 to 2005 and of Unicredit Banca Mobiliare SpA from 2000 to 2008.

Bruni's research areas are central banking and monetary policy; banking and financial regulation; the international monetary and financial system; and European economic and financial integration.

Up until 1990, Bruni was full professor of Economics and Finance at Università of Brescia. He has been a member of the Founding Committee of the Università of Bolzano, visiting scholar and visiting professor at New York University; University of California at Berkeley; Chulalongkorn University of Bangkok; Università Getulio Vargas of Sao Paulo; University of New South Wales in Sydney; UBC in Vancouver; and Fudan University in Shanghai.
